PM's masterclass with all students

Exams, knowledge not same, focus like batter in packed stadium, says PM

Leadership lessons, meditation, exams versus knowledge, focusing like a batter in action and using technology wisely, not fearfully -- Prime Minister Narendra Modi touched upon multiple issues in a free-wheeling chat with students during his annual 'Pariksha Pe Charcha' broadcast on Monday.

In a shift from the traditional town hall format, Modi preferred a more informal setting this time and held a more deeper and lively conversation with around 35 students at Sunder Nursery here.

The nationwide broadcast of the eighth edition of Pariksha Pe Charcha saw students, teachers and parents tuning in from different parts of the country. The interaction was also streamed on Amazon

Prime Minister Narendra Modi told students that knowledge and examinations are two different things. One should not view exams as be-all and end-all in life, he said.

During the interaction with students drawn from different states and Union Territories, the prime minister said students should not be confined and be allowed to explore their passion. He asked students to use their time in a planned way

for effective management.

The prime minister spoke on issues such as 'master your time master your life, live in the moment, finding positives, nourish to flourish', with students quizzing him on different matters.

Urging parents to not use their children as models to show off, he said they should not compare them with others and instead support them.

How can re-passed bills be referred to Prez? SC questions TN Gov silence

The Supreme Court on Monday questioned Tamil Nadu Governor R N Ravi's 'silence' before withholding assent to the bills passed by the legislative assembly and wondered how could he refer the 're-passed bills' to the President.

A bench of Justices J B Pardiwala and R Mahadevan posed questions to the Governor, represented by attorney general R Venkataramani, and reserved its verdict on the dispute. "Why was the Governor silent for years? Why did he not make any communication with the government? Then he withholds his assent and reserves the bills for the consideration of the President," it said.

It went on to ask, "How could he refer the re-passed bills to the President?" Venkataramani submitted there was no express provision in the Constitution which restrained the Governor from sending the re-passed bill to the President for consideration. The delay in giving assent by the Governor had prompted the state government to move the top court in 2023, claiming 12 bills, including one from 2020, were pending with him.

We'll have to watch closely, carefully what is happening in B'desh: Tharoor

Congress leader Shashi Tharoor on Monday said New Delhi will have to watch "closely and carefully" what is happening in Bangladesh, as he cautioned that the neighbouring country could be "our soft underbelly" and India might be very vulnerable if a hostile government were to come to power there.

During an interaction hosted at the Foreign Correspondents' Club (FCC) here on the occasion of a book launch, he also said, "We, as a friendly neighbour, should signal at all levels that our commitment

is to the well-being of the people of Bangladesh" rather than conveying "the impression that we are more concerned about either a particular political party or a particular community".

Currently, an interim government led by Chief Advisor Mohammad Yunus is in place in Bangladesh, which witnessed massive student-led protests last year leading to the fall of the Sheikh Hasina government.

Hasina fled to India on August 5 as protesters overrun the streets and government offices, and she has been living in India since then. Tharoor backed the hospitality and shelter ac-

corded to Hasina, saying there should not be any doubt about it.

The occasion was the launch of the book 'Indian Parliament: Shaping Foreign Policy' by veteran journalist and scholar K V Prasad.

After his remarks as the chair of the session, Tharoor, a Congress MP who also heads the Parliamentary Standing Committee on External Affairs, fielded a range of questions from the audience on subjects ranging from the Bangladesh situation to ties with Pakistan, and from Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to the US to nuances of parliamentary democracy.

Mamata rules out alliance with Cong for 2026 polls, TMC to go solo

West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Monday said that the Trinamool Congress would go it alone in the 2026 assembly elections in the state, dismissing any possibility of forging a coalition with the Congress or any other party, according to TMC sources. Addressing her party's lawmakers at a meeting ahead of the Assembly's budget session, the TMC supremo also expressed confidence about winning the elections next year with a two-third majority.

Omar meets Shah; discusses statehood, law and order issues

Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Monday called on Union Home Minister Amit Shah and discussed with him various issues, including restoration of statehood and law and order situation in the Union Territory. During the meeting, which lasted for 30 minutes, officials said the chief minister raised with Shah the issue of restoration of statehood to J&K.

On August 5, 2019, the Centre abrogated Article 370 which granted special status to J&K and bifurcated the erstwhile state into two UTs -- J&K and Ladakh.

During the meeting, Abdullah also briefed Shah about the situation in J&K after the two recent incidents -- the death of a person by suicide in Kathua in Jammu, and shooting of a truck driver after he did not stop at a checkpoint in Sopore in north Kashmir.

Bengal forest dept employee seriously hurt in tiger attack

Kolkata: A forest department employee was seriously injured on Monday after being attacked by a Royal Bengal Tiger at Maipith in West Bengal's South 24 Parganas district, a senior forest official said. The employee was part of a forest team tracking the movement of the tiger, which had strayed from the Ajmalmari forest in the Sunderbans Tiger Reserve into Maipith's Nagenbad village, an area covered with dense shrubs.

Ker political leaders appear in HC, apologise in contempt case

Leaders of various political parties facing contempt of court proceedings over road-block events in Kerala appeared before the High Court, tendering apologies for their actions.

Those who appeared before the court included CPI leaders Binoy Viswam and Pannian Raveendran, Congress leaders Mohammed Shiyas and T J Vinod, and CPI(M) leaders M Vijayakumar, Kadakampally Surendran, V K Prasanth, and V Joy. CPI(M) leader M V Govindan has been instructed to appear before the court on Wednesday at 4 pm.

Other political leaders, who appeared before the court, have been exempted from further personal appearances.

The court emphasised that roads are not meant for setting up stages and expressed dissatisfaction with the affidavit submitted by the police officials. The court ruled that the respondents no longer need to appear in person but must submit affidavits. It also stated that apologies from leaders and officials alone are not sufficient to resolve the issue. The

The leaders informed the court that they did not justify their actions

police officers involved have been directed to submit additional affidavits. The case will be considered again on March 3.

On February 5, the State Police Chief (SPC) informed the High Court that measures have been taken to sensitise police officers about existing laws and judicial orders to prevent the recurrence of roads or footpaths being blocked by public meetings or processions. DGP Shaikh Darvesh Sahib also told the court that a new circular was issued last month for the strict adherence to the provisions of the Kerala Public Ways (Restrictions of Assemblies and Processions) Act 2011 and for the proper compliance of judicial orders against the blocking of roads and footpaths. He also apologised for the inconvenience caused by various incidents of roads being blocked by public meetings or protests by political parties in different parts of the state.

'Good man' Kejri wants to oust Punjab CM, says BJP

With Aam Aadmi Party national convener Arvind Kejriwal due to meet his party's leader and Punjab chief minister Bhagwant Mann and other party MLAs from Punjab in Delhi on Tuesday, the BJP has started claiming that the former Delhi CM, after losing his own seat and the Delhi Assembly

polls, was now eyeing the Punjab CM's post. Senior BJP leader Manjinder Singh Sirsa, who also won his Assembly election from Rajouri Garden, took to "X" to state that, "After losing the Delhi elections, Arvind Kejriwal has called a meeting of Punjab MLAs in Delhi" and "reports suggest that he is trying to remove Bhagwant Mann from the CM post by branding him as incompetent."
